A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that a group attending 1 2 the Hawaii workforce development council's September 2006, forum identified a need for easy access to information on available 3 4 training without having to build extensive personal networks. 5 The group proposed an interactive, searchable web-based database 6 that: Enables employers and employees to find information on 7 (1) 8 classes and training programs that meet their training 9 needs; Enables employers to record their needs for training 10 (2)11 in defined competencies for specific numbers of employees and time periods; and 12 Enables providers to list their courses in a way that 13 (3) 14 is cross-referenced to the competencies needed by 15 employers. 16 Through such a system, employers can help drive the

17 curriculum development process by inputting their needs and

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using the database to identify providers to meet those training
 needs. Simultaneously, providers will be able to plan their
 curriculum development efforts based on valid demand data, and
 market their current offerings.

5 The purpose of this Act is to provide the University of 6 Hawaii with funding for the research and development of a 7 statewide web-based interactive searchable database that will 8 provide comprehensive workforce training information to 9 employers, employees, and training providers.

10 SECTION 2. The University of Hawaii shall design a
11 statewide web-based interactive searchable database in two
12 phases:

13 (1) Design the website to be able to accommodate

14 reasonable or future modifications and additions; and15 (2) Build and implement the website.

16 The design phase shall incorporate input from training 17 providers, the department of education, the department of labor 18 and industrial relations, the workforce development council, the 19 Chamber of Commerce of Hawaii, and employers. The system shall 20 be designed to accept employer needs for varying time periods. 21 The cost of the design phase shall not exceed fifteen per cent 22 of the total amount of moneys appropriated under this Act.



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1 The statewide web-based interactive searchable database 2 shall be in service no later than the convening of the 2008 3 legislature. If the statewide web-based interactive searchable 4 database is not in service by the convening of the 2008 5 legislature a status report shall be filed twenty days prior to 6 its convening indicating the database's status and the report shall continue on an annual basis until the database is 7 8 completed. The report shall include information reqarding 9 whether the funding is adequate and, if necessary, a request for 10 additional funding.

SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general 11 12 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$50,000, or so much 13 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, to the 14 University of Hawaii to design, research, and develop a 15 statewide web-based interactive searchable database. The University of Hawaii shall also contract for employment, 16 17 education, and training from public or private agencies and 18 nonprofit organizations, as needed, to implement and operate the 19 database.

20 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the University of 21 Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.

22 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007.
