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A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO NURSE AIDES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature recognizes that 42 United
 States Code sections 1395i-3 and 1396r require nurse aides
 working in nursing facilities participating in medicare and
 medicaid programs to be certified.

The purpose of this Act is to provide for the certification 5 and recertification of nurse aides who work in nursing 6 facilities participating in medicare and medicaid programs and 7 in other state licensed and certified health care settings. 8 Certifying these nurse aides will allow the department of 9 10 commerce and consumer affairs, the department of human services, and the department of health to monitor and evaluate the quality 11 and competency of the nurse aides practicing in the State. 12 SECTION 2. Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 13 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 14

15 and to read as follows:

4	intermediate care facility or skilled nursing facility licensed
5	pursuant to section 321-11(10) and certified by the department
6	of health in accordance with 42 United States Code sections
7	<u>1395i-3 and 1396r.</u>
8	"Medicare or medicaid nurse aide" means a certified nurse
9	aide who works in a medicare or medicaid certified nursing
10	facility.
11	"Nurse aide" means a person who performs a variety of
12	duties relating to patients and patient care working under the
13	supervision of a nurse, including assisting patients in all
14	activities of daily living such as serving and collecting food
15	trays, and helping patients get out of bed, bathe, and dress. A
16	nurse aide may also assist a nurse by changing bed linens,
17	delivering messages, and sterilizing instruments.
18	"State licensed or state certified health care setting"
19	means settings, other than medicare or medicaid certified
20	nursing facilities that are regulated by the department of
21	health or the department of human services.



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1	<u>"Sub</u>	stantiated finding" means documentation of the State's

21	<u>§457</u>	A- Medicare or medicaid nurse aide certification.
22	<u>(a) To b</u>	e certified, an applicant shall successfully complete:



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1	(1) Training in a state-approved training program; and
2	(2) A nurse aide examination approved by the director.
3	(b) No person shall be permitted to take the examination
4	who has not complied with the training requirements established
5	by the director of human services in accordance with 42 United
6	States Code sections 1395i-3 and 1396r.
7	(c) Reciprocity shall be granted to nurse aides who have
8	completed a state-approved program that meets both federal and
9	state requirements.
10	(d) Nurse aides employed in medicare or medicaid certified
11	nursing facilities shall meet both federal and state
12	requirements.
13	(e) Maintenance requirements for recertification shall be
14	on a biennial basis, including in-service training and
15	employment in a medicare or medicaid facility as required by
16	federal and state law.
17	(f) No charge shall be imposed on nurse aides for the
18	maintenance of the nurse aide registry.
19	§457A- Nurse aide certification for state licensed or
20	state certified facilities. (a) This certification applies to
21	nurse aides working in state licensed and state certified health



1	settings other than a medicare or medicaid certified nursing
2	facility.
3	(b) To be certified, an applicant shall successfully
4	complete:
5	(1) Training in a state-approved training program; and
6	(2) A nurse aide examination approved by the director.
7	(c) Fees may be imposed for services rendered to carry out
8	the purposes of this section.
9	(d) Reciprocity shall be granted to qualified nurse aides
10	who have completed a state-approved program the requirements of
11	which are comparable to the requirements of this chapter.
12	(e) Maintenance requirements for recertification shall be
13	on a biennial basis, including a competency evaluation as
14	approved by the department of human services and employment in a
15	state licensed or state certified health care setting."
16	SECTION 5. Section 457A-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
17	amended to read as follows:
18	"§457A-1 Findings and purpose. (a) The legislature
19	recognizes that 42 United States Code [§1395i-3 and §1396R]
20	sections 1395i-3 and 1396r require nurse aides working in
21	certified nursing facilities participating in medicare and
22	medicaid programs to be certified.

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1	(b) The legislature also recognizes that nurse aides who
2	work in state licensed or state certified health care settings
3	should be certified for the purpose of consumer safety and held to
4	similar standards of competency and evaluation appropriate for
5	these facilities. This chapter implements 42 United States Code
6	[§1395i 3 and §1396R] sections 1395i-3 and 1396r with respect to:
7	(1) Establishing the State's regulatory scheme for
8	certifying nurse aides;
9	(2) Defining the scope of regulation;
10	(3) Establishing standards for certification and biennial
11	recertification; and
12	(4) Establishing an interagency agreement between the
13	state agencies responsible for various aspects of the
14	program.
15	[(b) As used in this chapter, "nurse aide" means a person
16	who performs a variety of duties relating to patients and patient
17	care working under the supervision of a nurse, including but not
18	limited to assisting patients in all activities of daily living
19	such as serving and collecting food trays, and helping patients
20	get out of bed, bathe, and dress. A nurse aide may also assist a
21	nurse by changing bed linens, delivering messages, and sterilizing
22	instruments.]"



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1	SECTION 6. Section 457A-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended to read as follows:
3	"§457A-2 Implementation. (a) The director [of commerce and
4	consumer affairs] shall implement the provisions of this chapter,
5	in accordance with 42 United States Code [§1395i-3 and §1396R as
6	they] sections 1395-3 and 1396r, that relate [only] to
7	[establishing]:
8	(1) The minimum requirements and standards [necessary] for
9	certification as a nurse aide;
10	(2) Examination requirements, including the passing score;
11	(3) Maintenance requirements for continued certification
12	on a biennial basis; and
13	(4) Implementation of a <u>certified</u> nurse aide registry.
14	(b) The director of health shall implement the provisions of
15	this chapter, in accordance with 42 United States Code sections
16	1395i-3 and 1396r, that relate to disciplining certified nurse
17	aides who are employed in health care settings licensed or
18	certified by the department of health.
19	(c) The director of human services shall implement the
20	provisions of this chapter, in accordance with 42 United States
21	code sections 1395i-3 and 1396r, that relate to:

12	well as] s	sections 1395i-3 and 1396r and the federal regulations
13	adopted pu	irsuant thereto, [as they] <u>that</u> relate [only] to

15	(1)	The minimum requirements necessary for certification
16		as a nurse aide;
17	(2)	Examination requirements, including the passing score
18		and provisions for contesting examination results;
19	(3)	Maintenance requirements for continued certification;

21	(4)	Implementation and maintenance of a nurse aide
22		registry [-] containing certified nurse aides in
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1	medicare or medicaid certified nursing facilities and
2	certified nurse aides in other state licensed and
3	state certified health care settings.
4	(b) The director shall issue certificates to qualified nurse
5	aides and shall be responsible for maintenance of an up-to-date
6	nurse aide registry [which] <u>that</u> shall include the names of
7	certified nurse aides, their places of employment, and
8	[disciplinary actions. Disciplinary actions] all information that
9	is required to be reported by the department of health and the
10	department of human services. The director's role, with regard to
11	certified nurse aides, shall be limited to the placement [Θ f
12	substantiated findings from] into the nurse aide registry of all
13	information and substantiated findings from the department of
14	health [into the nurse aide registry within ten working days of
15	court settlement.] and the department of human services, as
16	required by 42 United States Code sections 1395i-3 and 1396r,
17	within ten working days of the finding, which information shall
18	permanently remain in the registry except if:
19	(1) The finding was made in error;
20	(2) The individual is found not guilty in court; or
21	(3) The State receives notification of the individual's
22	death."



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SECTION 8. Any nurse aide who is employed in a state 1 licensed or state certified health care setting and who is 2 recertified by July 1, 2007, may be recertified on a biennial 3 basis under chapter 457A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, if the nurse 4 aide passes, by December 31, 2008, a proficiency evaluation 5 approved by the department of human services. If the nurse aide 6 fails to pass the proficiency evaluation, the nurse aide shall 7 apply for certification as a new applicant and undergo 8 recertification under chapter 457A, Hawaii Revised Statutes. 9 10 SECTION 9. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 11 SECTION 10. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050. 12
