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A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PRESCRIPTION DRUG COST CONTAINMENT AND AFFORDABLE ACCESS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Prescription drugs have become an increasingly
 important part of health care, especially among older adults.
 Prescription drugs have also become the most expensive component
 of health care, accounting for approximately two-thirds of
 health care costs.

6 In 2002, the legislature adopted the Hawaii Rx program, 7 intended to help a large population of Hawaii residents better 8 afford their prescription drugs through a discount program, 9 thereby increasing the overall health of Hawaii residents, promoting healthy communities, and protecting public health and 10 welfare. In 2004, the program was amended to become the Hawaii 11 Rx plus program. Implemented in July 2005, Hawaii Rx plus has 12 13 enabled thousands of Hawaii residents, regardless of age, to 14 take advantage of discounted prices for their prescription drug 15 needs when no other insurance or payor are available to them. 16 In 2005, in anticipation of the new Medicare Modernization

17 Act's Part D program, which took effect on January 1, 2006, the



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state medicare part D state pharmacy assistance program was
 created. The state medicare part D program covers the co payments for medicare and medicaid dual eligible clients to
 ensure a smooth transition of prescription drug coverage from
 medicaid to medicare.

6 The federal Medicare Modernization Act of 2005 also 7 provides special relief for qualified state pharmacy assistance 8 programs. Both the Hawaii Rx plus program and the state 9 medicare part D program are recognizable under federal law as 10 state pharmacy assistance programs and, if they are combined 11 under an umbrella program and approved as a single federally 12 recognized program, could receive enhanced benefits from the 13 federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services.

14 This Act would administratively consolidate both the Hawaii 15 Rx plus program and the state medicare part D program into a 16 single state pharmacy assistance program for which the State 17 could then seek approval from the federal Centers for Medicare 18 and Medicaid Services to recognize this newly consolidated 19 program as a federally qualified state pharmacy assistance 20 program for the purpose of receiving revenues from drug manufacturer rebates. 21

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1 Through this administrative consolidation, the state 2 medicare part D program would remain the same and its enrollees would be identified as "tier one enrollees" and the Hawaii Rx 3 4 plus program would remain the same and its enrollees would be identified as "tier two enrollees". In addition, this Act would 5 provide prescription drug assistance for a subset of the Hawaii 6 Rx plus population, identified as the "tier three enrollees", 7 who may be at risk of becoming medicaid eligible and for whom 8 the State will seek approval from the federal Centers for 9 Medicare and Medicaid Services to allow the mandating of rebates 10 from drug manufacturers resulting in greater discounts. 11

The State of Hawaii will continue to receive pharmacy 12 13 discounts for individuals in the Hawaii Rx plus program with incomes up to three hundred fifty per cent of the federal 14 poverty level. With federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid 15 Services approval, the State will also be able to begin 16 17 mandating rebates from pharmaceutical companies for prescription drugs purchased by individuals in the Hawaii Rx plus program who 18 19 are at risk of qualifying for medicaid with incomes equal to or less than three hundred per cent of the federal poverty level as 20 21 approved by the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid 22 Services.

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
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1 The State of Hawaii may also be able to combine the 2 purchasing power of these two programs to negotiate larger discounts, similar to federal government and private health 3 insurers, as approved by the federal Centers for Medicare and 4 5 Medicaid Services. Finally, combining both programs into a 6 federally qualified state pharmacy assistance program 7 streamlines operations and promotes effective administration. 8 The federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services is 9 requiring a state statute before they will consider a request for approval of the income eligibility for the medicaid at-risk 10 11 population and set the percentage of state contribution that will be required towards the cost of the prescription drugs for 12 13 the at-risk population, which will allow the mandating of 14 rebates for this group. 15 This Act, to be known as the "Hawaii Prescription Drug

16 Affordability Act of 2007", seeks to further drive down the cost
17 of prescription drugs for Hawaii's uninsured, underinsured, low18 income, elderly and disabled residents.

SECTION 2. Chapter 346, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
amended by adding four new sections to part XV to be
appropriately designated and to read as follows:

1	"§346-A Program goals. The legislature finds that
2	affordability is critical in providing Hawaii residents with
3	access to prescription drugs. This section is enacted by the
4	legislature to enable the State to make prescription drugs more
5	affordable for qualified Hawaii residents and thereby increase
6	the overall health of Hawaii residents, promote healthy
7	communities, and protect the public health and welfare. The
8	legislature also intends that the program be integrated as much
9	as possible with other state health programs. It is not the
10	intention of the legislature for this law to discourage
11	employers from offering to pay, or from paying for prescription
12	drug benefits for their employees, or to supplant employer-
13	sponsored prescription drug benefit plans.
14	§346-B Hawaii Rx plus preferred drug list. (a) All drugs
15	shall be available at the medicaid discount price, or less. The
16	Hawaii Rx plus preferred drug list shall offer an additional
17	"secondary discount price", or less, on preferred drugs, to be
18	reimbursed through the Hawaii state pharmacy assistance program
19	special fund.
20	(b) The department shall establish secondary discounts for
21	drugs covered by a rebate agreement and shall promote the use of



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1	safe, efficacious, and cost-effective drugs, taking into			
2	consideration:			
3	(1)	Reduced prices for state and federally capped drug		
4		programs;		
5	(2)	Differential dispensing fees;		
6	(3)	Administrative costs of the department; and		
7	(4)	The recommendation of the pharmacy and therapeutic		
8		committee.		
9	(c)	The department shall establish a Hawaii Rx plus		
10	preferred	drug list that includes but is not limited to:		
11	(1)	Drugs listed on the State's medicaid preferred drug		
12		<u>list;</u>		
13	(2)	Any other drugs listed on the Hawaii Rx plus preferred		
14		drug list pursuant to this section; and		
15	(3)	Generic drugs that are priced using a maximum		
16		allowable cost list, as determined by the department.		
17	(d)	The department shall establish a pharmacy and		
18	therapeut	ic committee to advise the state medicaid director on		
19	the Hawai:	i Rx plus preferred drug list. The pharmacy and		
20	therapeut:	ic committee shall review and recommend drugs for		
21	placement	on the Hawaii Rx plus preferred drug list, striving to		
22	identify (the safest and most efficacious drugs that are		
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1	available	at the lowest cost. The committee's recommendations
2	may take	into consideration any of the following factors:
3	(1)	Therapeutic value for the disease or condition under
4		treatment;
5	(2)	<u>Clinical efficacy;</u>
6	(3)	Safety;
7	(4)	Cost; and
8	(5)	Other relevant factors as determined by the committee.
9	<u>(e)</u>	When considering categories of drugs designed to treat
10	specializ	ed chronic medical conditions and diseases, the
11	committee	shall consult with physicians and other health care
12	professio	nals with specialized clinical knowledge and expertise
13	in this a	rea, either in their capacity as consultants serving on
14	a subcomm	ittee of the committee, or as physicians or pharmacists
15	with a pr	actice or specialty in chronic diseases.
16	<u>(f)</u>	The determination of a drug's safety and efficacy
17	shall be	consistent with the standards set forth in the peer-
18	reviewed	literature and other available sources, including but
19	<u>not limit</u>	ed to:
20	(1)	The American Hospital Formulary Service Drug
21		Information;
22	(2)	The United States Pharmacopoeia Drug Information;

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1	(3) The DRUGDEX System; and
2	(4) The American Medical Association Drug Evaluations.
3	(g) The determination of a drug's net cost shall consider
4	the pharmacy reimbursement amount authorized under section
5	346-D, as adjusted by manufacturer's rebates to be paid to the
6	department. The committee shall determine that a drug has no
7	significant clinical or safety advantages over one or more
8	alternative drugs when used for a given purpose before it may
9	consider the drug's net cost.
10	§346-C Participating and nonparticipating manufacturers
11	and labelers. (a) The names of manufacturers that enter and do
12	not enter into rebate agreements pursuant to this section shall
13	be deemed public information. The department shall release this
14	information to health care providers and the public.
15	(b) The department or administrator shall also make
16	available to health care providers information about the
17	relative cost of drugs produced by manufacturers that enter into
18	rebate agreements compared to the cost of drugs produced by
19	those that do not enter into rebate agreements, as allowed by
20	law.
21	§346-D Pharmacy reimbursement. (a) A pharmacy shall

2	be determined by the department, the department shall reimburse

5	(b) The department shall collect pharmacy use data				
6	necessary to calculate the amount of the manufacturer rebate				
7	under section 346-C. The department shall protect the				
8	confidentiality of information received as required under state				
9	or federal law, rule, or regulation.				
10	(c) The department shall not impose transaction charges on				
11	participating pharmacies that submit claims or receive payments				
12	under the program."				
13	SECTION 3. Section 346-341, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is				
14	amended by:				
15	1. Adding fourteen new definitions to be appropriately				
16	inserted and to read as follows:				
17	"Administrator" means the director of human services.				
18	"Discount" means the amount by which the price of a drug				
19	sold by a pharmacy is reduced as determined by the department of				
20	human services.				
21	"Hawaii Rx plus program" means the prescription drug				
22	discount program that provides discounts to qualified Hawaii				

1	residents who are uninsured or underinsured through manufacturer
2	rebates and pharmacy discounts.
3	"Hawaii state pharmacy assistance program" means the
4	program that covers the co-payments for eligible seniors and
5	disabled individuals under the medicare part D drug benefit and
6	the prescription drug discounts for the Hawaii Rx plus program.
7	"Initial discount price" as it pertains to a drug means the
8	price that the department pays medicaid participating pharmacies
9	to purchase the drug for its medicaid members.
10	"Manufacturer" means anyone who is engaged in
11	manufacturing, preparing, propagating, compounding, processing,
12	packaging, repackaging, or labeling a prescription drug.
13	"Participating pharmacy" or "retail pharmacy" means a
14	retail pharmacy located in this State, or another business
15	licensed to dispense prescription drugs in this State, that
16	elects to participate in the program.
17	"Pharmacy and therapeutic committee" means the committee
18	established by the department that advises the state medicaid
19	director on the Hawaii Rx plus preferred drug list.
20	"Preferred drug" includes but is not limited to:
21	(1) A drug listed on the State's medicaid preferred drug
22	list;



- 1 (2) An antipsychotic drug;
- 2 (3) An antidepressant drug;
- 3 (4) A chemotherapy drug;
- 4 (5) An antiretroviral drug;
- 5 (6) An immunosuppressive drug; and
- 6 (7) Any other drug listed on the Hawaii Rx plus preferred
 7 drug list pursuant to this part.
- 8 "Secondary discount price" as it pertains to a drug means
- 9 the initial discount price less any further discounts paid out
- 10 of the Hawaii state pharmacy assistance program special fund.
- 11 "State medicare part D program" means the medicare part D
- 12 state pharmacy assistance program that provides co-payments for
- 13 qualified Hawaii residents.

14 <u>"Tier one enrollee" means a beneficiary who qualifies for</u>

- 15 the medicare part D state pharmacy assistance program.
- 16 "Tier two enrollee" means a beneficiary who qualifies for
- 17 the Hawaii Rx plus program and whose household income is equal
- 18 to or less than three hundred fifty per cent of the federal
- 19 poverty level.
- 20 "Tier three enrollee" means a beneficiary who qualifies for
- 21 the Hawaii Rx plus program and whose household income is equal
- 22 to or less than three hundred per cent of the federal poverty

1 level as approved by the federal Centers for Medicare and 2 Medicaid Services." 2. Amending the definitions of "asset test", "contractor", 3 and "enrollee" to read as follows: 4 5 ""Asset test" means the asset limits for eligibility in the [state pharmacy assistance program] state medicare part D 6 program as defined by the Medicare Modernization Act and any 7 8 amendments thereto. 9 "Contractor" means the person, partnership, or corporate 10 entity that has an approved contract with the department to 11 administer the Hawaii state pharmacy assistance program as established under this part. 12 "Enrollee" means a resident of this State who meets the 13 14 conditions specified in this part and in departmental rules 15 relating to eligibility for participating in the Hawaii state 16 pharmacy assistance program and whose application for enrollment 17 in the Hawaii state pharmacy assistance program has been 18 approved by the department." 19 SECTION 4. 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1	Hawaii state pharmacy assistance program[-], which shall provide
2	benefits for enrollees in the state medicare part D program and
3	the Hawaii Rx plus program. Provided that there are no
4	federally approved prescription drug plans available in the
5	State that provide a full coverage prescription drug benefit,
6	the [state pharmacy assistance program] state medicare part D
7	program may coordinate the prescription drug coverage with [the]
8	any benchmark federal medicare part D prescription drug plan
9	benefit, including related supplies, as determined by the
10	department, to each resident who meets the eligibility
11	requirements as outlined in section 346-343. The Hawaii Rx plus
12	program shall combine the purchasing power of all qualified
13	residents to enable the State to reduce prescription drug costs,
14	as approved by the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid
15	Services, and further improve the quality of healthcare for
16	qualified Hawaii residents in the program, thereby increasing
17	the overall health of Hawaii residents, promoting healthy
18	communities, and protecting the public health and welfare.
19	(b) The department may provide enrollment assistance to
20	eligible individuals into the [state pharmacy assistance
21	program.] state medicare part D program. Enrollment for

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medicaid dual eligible persons shall begin no later than
 October 1, 2005.

3 (c) [The] For the state medicare part D program, the
4 department shall allow any willing <u>benchmark</u> prescription drug
5 plan approved by the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid
6 Services to provide the coordination of benefits between the
7 [State's medicare prescription drug program] state medicare part
8 D program and the federal medicare part D drug benefit.

9 (d) The department may administer the state pharmacy 10 assistance program or contract with a third party or parties in 11 accordance with chapter 103F to administer any single component or combination of components of the state pharmacy assistance 12 13 program, including outreach, eligibility, enrollment, claims, 14 administration, rebate negotiations and recovery, and 15 redistribution, in order to coordinate the prescription drug 16 benefits of the state pharmacy assistance program and the 17 federal medicare part D drug benefit.

(e) Any contract with third parties to administer any
component of the state pharmacy assistance program shall be
established either at no cost to the State, or on a
contingency-fee basis and with no up-front costs to the State,
as may be negotiated by the department.



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(f) Any contract with third parties to administer any
 component of the state pharmacy assistance program shall
 prohibit the contractor from receiving any compensation or other
 benefits from any pharmaceutical manufacturer participating in
 the state pharmacy assistance program.

(g) A prescription drug manufacturer or labeler that sells
prescription drugs in the State may enter into a rebate
agreement with the department. The rebate agreement may be
agreed upon by the manufacturer or the labeler to make rebate
payments to the department each calendar quarter or according to
a schedule established by the department.

12 (h) The department or contractor may negotiate the amount
13 of the rebate required from a manufacturer or labeler in
14 accordance with this part.

(i) The department or contractor [may] shall take into
consideration the rebate calculated under the medicaid rebate
program pursuant to title 42 United States Code Section 1396r-8,
the average [wholesale] manufacturer price of prescription
drugs, and any other cost data related to prescription drug
prices and price discounts.

(j) The department or contractor shall use their bestefforts to obtain the best possible rebate amount.

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1	(k) The department may prescribe the application and
2	enrollment procedures for prospective enrollees.
3	(1) The department shall conduct ongoing quality assurance
4	activities similar to those used in the State's medicaid
5	program.
6	(m) A prescription drug manufacturer or labeler that sells
7	prescription drugs in the State shall enter into a rebate
8	agreement with the department, as provided by the federal
9	Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services."
10	SECTION 5. Section 346-343, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
11	amended to read as follows:

19	shall be funded with state appropriations, including funds, as
20	approved by the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid
21	Services, derived from revenues to the State from rebates paid



[-]] HAWAII STATE PHARMACY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM" 3 4 SECTION 9. Part XIII of chapter 346, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is repealed. 5 SECTION 10. The department of human services shall conduct 6 7 a study in order to gather information on the size of the target 8 population, utilization data, and other information as needed in 9 order for the department of human services to identify the 10 amount of the appropriation needed to implement the secondary 11 discount price and other costs of the program. 12 There is appropriated out of the general SECTION 11. 13 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$, or so 14 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, to 15 be paid into the Hawaii state pharmacy assistance program 16 special fund. 17 There is appropriated out of the Hawaii state pharmacy 18 assistance program special fund the sum of \$, or so 19 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, to 20 the department of human services for the purposes of conducting 21 the study mandated in section 10 of this Act.
