SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION AND THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO "BUY LOCAL" TO ENCOURAGE SUSTAINABILITY.

WHEREAS, the Department of Education and the Department of 1 Health are two of the largest state departments in terms of 2 budget, personnel, and purchases; and 3 4 WHEREAS, current law requires procurement preferences ("buy 5 local") to be given to "Hawaii products" under section 6 103D-1002, Hawaii Revised Statutes, defined under section 7 103D-1001, Hawaii Revised Statutes, as products that are mined, 8 excavated, produced, manufactured, raised, or grown in the State 9 where the input constitutes no less than twenty-five per cent of 10 the manufactured cost; and 11 12 WHEREAS, section 3-120-4, Hawaii Administrative Rules, 13 exempts the procurement of certain goods and services from 14 chapter 103D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, including but not limited 15 to the purchase of fresh meats and produce; and 16 17 WHEREAS, Act 8, Special Session Laws of Hawaii 2005, 18 created the Hawai'i 2050 Sustainability Task Force; and 19 20 WHEREAS, Act 8 was based on the belief of the Legislature 21 that government is responsible not only for resolving daily and 22 annual issues, but also to assure the sustainability of the 23 State for generations to come (Auditor's Report, December 2005); 24 and 25 26 27 WHEREAS, one of the major concerns of the Hawai'i 2050 Sustainability Task Force was the reality that Hawaii is an 28 island state and is dependent heavily on imports of literally 29 most things; and 30 31 32 WHEREAS, to the extent that Hawaii may reduce its dependence on purchases of out-of-state products through buying 33

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from in-state suppliers, the more it benefits the local economy 1 and the more it reduces our dependence on shipping; and 2 3 4 WHEREAS, one of the "Priority actions: Intermediate steps for the year 2020" of the Hawai'i 2050 Sustainability Plan is to 5 "increase production and consumption of local foods and 6 products, particularly agriculture; and 7 8 WHEREAS, local diversified agricultural produce includes 9 fruits and vegetables such as banana, longan, lychee, papaya, 10 pineapple, baby green lettuce, romaine lettuce, round onion, 11 taro, and tomato; local cattle farms produce beef and furnish 12 milk; and 13 14 WHEREAS, "buy local" is critical to the long-term 15 sustainability of the food and manufacturing sectors of Hawaii's 16 17 economy; and 18 WHEREAS, the Department of Education and the Department of 19 Health are major state government purchasers of food stuffs and 20 other goods and products that can be locally grown or produced 21 if the local demand is sufficient; and 22 23 WHEREAS, the Department of Education and the Department of 24 Health play major roles, with their combined purchasing power, 25 in helping Hawaii to meet the priority action of increasing 26 production, particularly in agriculture, and consumption of 27 local foods and products; now, therefore, 28 29 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fourth 30 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2008, the 31 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of 32 Education and the Department of Health are urged in their 33 respective procurements to practice "buy local" to the maximum 34 extent possible to encourage sustainability; and 35 36 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 37 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Superintendent of 38 Education, Director of Health, and the Governor. 39

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
