Your Committee on Tourism & Culture, to which was referred
H.B. No. 3428 entitled:

"A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE HAWAIIAN LANGUAGE,"

begs leave to report as follows:

The purpose of this bill is to recognize the significance of
the Hawaiian language to our state by requiring the Department of
Accounting and General Services to:

- (1) Develop a plan to have all signs in the State Capitol in
both Hawaiian and English; and
- (2) Submit the plan, including proposed legislation if
applicable, to the Legislature prior to the 2009 Regular
Session.

The Representative of the Fifth Representative District
supported this bill.

As this bill makes its way through the legislative process,
your Committee respectfully requests future legislative efforts to
consider whether an appropriation should be included in this
measure.




Your Committee has amended this measure by:
