Madam:

Your Committee on Judiciary and Labor, to which was referred
S.B. No. 1334 entitled:

"A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO NAME CHANGES,"

begs leave to report as follows:

The purpose of this measure is to provide a process for which
convicted sex offenders who want to change their names may do so
by more than a simple petition to the Lieutenant Governor.

Currently, a person may be able to change his or her name by
a simple petition to the Lieutenant Governor's Office. There is
no administrative hearing to test the validity of a petitioner's
name change request. The office relies solely upon the
information provided by the petitioner in determining which name
changes are appropriate for processing.

Your Committee finds that recently, a number of convicted sex
offenders with an ongoing obligation to register as sex offenders
have petitioned to change their names, some of them while still
incarcerated for their crime. It was pointed out that if a
convicted sex offender changes his or her name, it will be
extremely difficult to track that individual if that individual
does not comply with the requirements of sex offender
registration.

This bill provides that a convicted sex offender may change
his or her name in one of several ways such as through a Family
Court order, upon marriage, by order of a court in any other

jurisdiction, or by order of a court in this jurisdiction that determines that it is in the interest of justice and that it will not adversely affect public safety.

Your Committee received testimonies in support of the bill from the Attorney General's Office and the Lieutenant Governor's Office. There was no testimony in opposition to this bill.

Your Committee amended the bill by changing the effective date to July, 2059.

As affirmed by the record of votes of the members of your Committee on Judiciary and Labor that is attached to this report, your Committee is in accord with the intent and purpose of S.B. No. 1334, as amended herein, and recommends that it pass Second Reading in the form attached hereto as S.B. No. 1334, S.D. 1, and be placed on the calendar for Third Reading.
