<u>HB 2309</u>	MAKING AN APPROPRIATION RELATING TO OVERSIGHT OF CHARITABLE ORGANIZATIONS. Appropriates funds for the attorney general to provide more rigorous monitoring of expenditures and fundraising activities of charities.	CPC/JUD, FIN
<u>HB 2308</u>	RELATING TO CHARITABLE ORGANIZATIONS. Requires charitable organizations to register with the attorney general.	CPC/JUD, FIN
<u>HB 2749</u>	RELATING TO PERSONAL INFORMATION. Implements recommendations of the 12/2007 report of the Hawaii identity theft task force to protect the security of personal information collected and maintained by state and county government.	CPC/JUD, FIN



<u>HB 2252</u>	<p>RELATING TO INSURANCE.</p> <p>Replaces the property and liability insurance guaranty association act with the National Conference of Insurance Legislators post-assessment property liability insurance guaranty association model act, which provides among other things expanded provisions on "covered claims" and replaces the association's power to cancel policies issued by insolvent insurers with immunity from pre-liquidation settlements of the insurer.</p>	CPC/JUD, FIN
<u>HB 2326</u>	<p>RELATING TO MORTGAGES.</p> <p>Imposes certain restrictions on foreclosure consultants. Requires foreclosure consulting contracts to be in writing containing full disclosure of nature of consulting services to be provided, along with right to cancel. Prohibits certain acts by foreclosure consultants. Requires disclosures relating to foreclosure reconveyances and right to rescind any transfer of deed or title by homeowner. Exempts measure from "Sunrise Law" review.</p>	CPC/JUD, FIN
<u>HB 3088</u>	<p>RELATING TO RESIDENTIAL MORTGAGE PRACTICES.</p> <p>Repeals the law on Mortgage Brokers and Solicitors, chapter 454, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and replaces it with a statute that provides for more specialized regulation of residential mortgage brokers, residential mortgage lenders and residential loan originators by the Division of Financial Institutions.</p>	CPC/JUD, FIN
<u>HB 3104</u>	<p>RELATING TO THE PREVENTION OF MORTGAGE RESCUE FRAUD.</p> <p>Requires mortgage foreclosure rescuers to provide specific information and disclosures to distressed property owners as well as impose specific prohibitions on mortgage foreclosure rescuers.</p>	CPC/JUD, FIN
<u>HB 2691</u>	<p>RELATING TO CONDOMINIUMS: MAKING VARIOUS TECHNICAL AMENDMENTS TO THE HAWAII REVISED STATUTES FOR THE PURPOSE OF CORRECTING ERRORS AND REFERENCES, AND CLARIFYING LANGUAGE.</p> <p>Amends various provisions of the Hawaii Revised Statutes relating to condominiums for the purpose of correcting errors and references, and clarifying language.</p>	CPC/JUD
<u>HB 2692</u>	<p>MAKING VARIOUS HOUSEKEEPING AMENDMENTS TO VOLUME 11 OF THE HAWAII REVISED STATUTES FOR THE PURPOSE OF CORRECTING ERRORS AND REFERENCES, AND CLARIFYING LANGUAGE.</p> <p>Amends various provisions of volume 11 of the Hawaii Revised Statutes for the purpose of correcting errors and references, and clarifying language.</p>	CPC/JUD



DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW


