HB 3096

RELATING TO INSURANCE.

CPC/JUD, FIN

Adopts National Association of Insurance Commissioners (NAIC) Model provisions relating to the insurers' disclosure of material financial transactions and actuarial reports. The uniform reporting requirements for all insurers is necessary to meet NAIC requirements

for accreditation.

HB 3097

RELATING TO INSURANCE.

CPC/JUD, FIN

Provides insurers with greater investment flexibility by updating the Insurance Code to reflect the investment strategies, such as stocks, bonds, and notes developed since the Code was last updated in 1987. HB 3098

RELATING TO ACTIVITIES REGULATED BY THE INSURANCE

CPC/JUD, FIN

COMMISSIONER.

Creates uniformity between other states' laws and Hawaii law in regard to licensing requirements. Increases educational requirements to keep a license, automatically inactivates a license if fees are not paid on time, allows reactivation if the fee is paid in 30 days, and broadens the types of reinsurance that can be used to meet the financial obligations

of insurance agents.

HB 3103

RELATING TO INSURANCE.

CPC/JUD, FIN

Clarifies suspension pending a hearing requirements for actions to suspend, revoke, or refuse to renew a license. Establishes a cap on the bond amount that managing general agents are required to furnish. Requires insurers to require managing general agents's compliance with bond and errors and omissions policy requirements. Conforms financial statement filing requirements for title insurers with existing

law.

HB 2749

RELATING TO PERSONAL INFORMATION.

CPC/JUD, FIN

Implements recommendations of the 12/2007 report of the Hawaii identity theft task force to protect the security of personal information

collected and maintained by state and county government.
