Addresses medical malpractice insurance costs by capping noneconomic damages at \$250,000, establishing a limit of \$3,000,000 for noneconomic damages determined by the court to be catastrophic damages, and requiring that economic damages be allocated based upon proportionate percentage of negligence. Sunsets June 30, 2013.
