manufactured in the State.

RELATING TO SHOPPING CARTS.

EDB, EEP, FIN

Allows abandoned shopping carts to be confiscated by the refuse division of any county with a population greater than 500,000; allows the county to impose a \$50 pick-up fee or a \$100 recycling fee.
