(HSCR84-08)

RELATING TO FUEL TAX.  
Clarifies that the license tax on diesel fuel is 1 cent, rather than 2 cents if used in power-generating facilities.

Provides the natural energy laboratory of Hawaii authority with funds to obtain an environmental impact statement to support rezoning of certain land from conservation to urban.~~

HB 3442

RELATING TO RENEWABLE ENERGY.  
Makes an appropriation for the Hawaii county economic opportunity council to establish a renewable energy project to build components for rechargeable, battery-powered automobiles.

HB 2711

RELATING TO INTEGRATED SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT.  
Permit the department of health to distribute excess moneys in the deposit beverage container deposit special fund to the counties to support the establishment and maintenance of recycling programs.

HB 2779

RELATING TO GRAY WATER.  
Requires the department of health to establish a gray water recycling program.

EEP, FIN

HB 3213

RELATING TO AIR POLLUTION.  
Removes the maximum limitation on fees for air pollution emissions from covered sources.

HB 3444 RELATING TO ENERGY. EEP, FIN  
Establishes the energy security special fund and the energy security tax and appropriates moneys. Effective 7/1/08.

HB 2661 RELATING TO SPECIAL PURPOSE REVENUE BONDS TO ASSIST INDUSTRIAL ENTERPRISES. EEP, FIN  
Authorizes the issuance of special purpose revenue bonds in a total amount not to exceed \$38,000,000 to assist Hui Mana 'Oma'o to establish facilities to convert potential renewable energy resources into electrical energy for public consumption.

HB 2825 RELATING TO THE ISSUANCE OF SPECIAL PURPOSE REVENUE BONDS TO ASSIST SOPOGY INC., IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF RENEWABLE ENERGY ON THE ISLAND OF OAHU. EEP, FIN  
Authorizes the issuance of special purpose revenue bonds in an amount not exceeding \$35,000,000 to assist Sopogy, Inc. with planning, designing, construction, equipping, and operating a solar farm power plant on the island of Oahu to produce electricity from solar power.
