RELATING TO THE DEPOSIT BEVERAGE CONTAINER **ENE** SB 2841 PROGRAM. Testimony Requires retail dealers with more than 75,000 square feet of retail space to operate redemption centers. ENE, CPH SB 2628 Requires telephone utilities and companies that publish or distribute Testimony telephone directories to distribute directories only upon receiving written authorization executed by the customer. Repeals in 2015. RELATING TO HEALTH. SB 2629 ENE, WAM Prohibits use of polystyrene foam takeout food containers beginning **Testimony** January 1, 2010. Requires department of health to find alternatives to polystyrene containers. Makes appropriation. SB 2001 RELATING TO SOLID WASTE. ENE, WAM Prohibits the use of polystyrene foam as a disposable food service-Testimony ware product.

<u>SB 2933</u>	RELATING TO HOUSEHOLD ENERGY DEMAND.	ENE, CPH

Allows for the use of clotheslines on any privately owned singlefamily residential dwelling regardless of a contrary provision in any

instrument or contract.
