<u>HB 2962</u> <u>Status</u>  (Email Testimony)	RELATING TO AFTER-SCHOOL PROGRAMS. Appropriates funds for the Safe Haven after school program in the county of Hawaii.	FIN
<u>HB 2040</u> <u>Status</u>  (Email Testimony)	RELATING TO HAWAII'S ECONOMY. Authorizes an independent study and analysis of Hawaii's economy, including recommendations for public policy changes that will begin to address the cost of living, affordability, and quality of life issues that Hawaii residents face.	FIN
<u>HB 2611</u> <u>Status</u>  (Email Testimony)	RELATING TO IOLANI PALACE. Establishes standards and conditions for the receipt of funds appropriated to the State of Hawaii Museum of Monarchy History.	FIN
<u>HB 2966</u> <u>Status</u>  (Email Testimony)	RELATING TO PUBLIC LANDS. Permits certain lessees of sites on public lands to sublet the whole or part of the demised premises without approval of the board of land and natural resources; provided that the sublease term shall not exceed one week, the rent charged to the sublessee shall not exceed an amount necessary for the lessee to cover the lessee's operational costs, and the demised premises shall be used substantially for the purposes for which it was originally intended. 
