Allows agricultural businesses to continue to qualify for zone benefits in case of force majeure events; includes leased and jointly employed workers in hiring formulas; changes schedule of hiring increases; counts value-added agricultural product retail sales towards qualification for tax credits; disallows general excise tax exemption for agricultural product retail sales.

**Proposed HD2:** Provides tax credit to resident taxpayers for long-term care insurance premiums at lesser of \$2,500 or 50% of the amount of the insurance premium paid. Prohibits a medical expense deduction for long-term care insurance cost if long-term care tax credit is claimed.

RELATING TO TAX CREDITS.  
**Proposed HD2:** Grants tax credit to small businesses at the lesser of 50% of premiums or \$500 per employee for purchase of long-term care insurance for its employees. Defines small business as businesses employing less than 100 full-time or part-time workers.


