<u>SB 3206, SD2</u> <u>(HSCR1173-08)</u> Status  (Email Testimony)	RELATING TO KAWAI NUI MARSH. Establishes the Kawai Nui marsh advisory council; appropriates moneys to DLNR for the work of the council.	WLH, FIN
<u>SB 2646, SD2, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR1323-08)</u> Status  (Email Testimony)	RELATING TO IMPORTANT AGRICULTURAL LANDS. Provides incentives and protections to establish and sustain viable agricultural operations on important agricultural lands, and provides for the designation of important agricultural lands on public lands.	WLH/AGR, FIN
<u>SB 2004, SD2, HD2</u> <u>(HSCR1334-08)</u> Status  (Email Testimony)	RELATING TO EDUCATION. Extends from 90 days to one year of a unilateral special education placement, the time allowed for parents, guardians, or the Department of Education to request an impartial hearing regarding reimbursement for the costs of a child's placement. Requires DOE to monitor all children who have undergone unilateral special education placement. Requires DOE to submit an annual report to the Legislature on the total number of requests for such due process hearings.	EDN, JUD, FIN
<u>SB 2423, SD2, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR1225-08)</u> Status  (Email Testimony)	RELATING TO LAND ACQUISITION. Directs the governor, or the governor's designee, to acquire lands owned by Kuilima Resort Company, Oaktree Capital, LLC, and their successors in interest, commonly known as Turtle Bay Hotel and Resort located in Kahuku, Oahu.	WLH, TAC, FIN

- Measure number;
- If you will be testifying in person or submitting written testimony only;
- The Committee the comments are directed to; and
- The number of copies the Committee is requesting.

While every effort will be made to copy, organize, and collate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed to the incorrect office, may be distributed to the Committee after the hearing.

Submit testimony in ONE of the following ways:

FAX: For comments less than 5 pages in length, transmit to 586-6001 (Oahu) or 1-800-535-3859 (Neighbor Islands);


