HB 112 RELATING TO HUMAN SERVICES. HSH
Short form bill relating to Human Services.

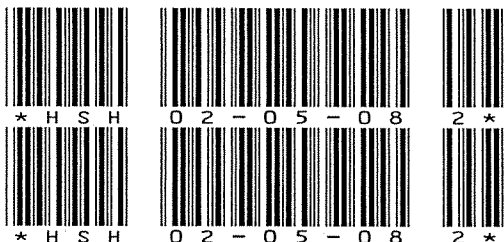
As this is a decision making meeting only, no public testimony will be accepted.

HB 2845 RELATING TO PUBLIC HOUSING. HSH, JUD
Proposed HD1: Prohibits the Hawaii Public Housing Authority from terminating the tenancy of both tenants after their divorce or legal separation, upon meeting certain conditions.

HB 2596 RELATING TO CHILDREN. HSH, JUD
Proposed HD1: Requires the Department of Human Services to investigate reports of drug use by a parent or legal custodian in the home of a child within 24 hours. Requires a parent or legal custodian to be drug free for at least 60 days prior to being allowed visitation with a child and to participate in substance abuse treatment for at least one year before being awarded full custody of a child.
