The Joint Legislative Committee on Family Caregiving will meet to address two different methods of providing financial assistance to family caregivers: (1) Cash and Counseling, and (2) a Refundable Caregiver Tax Credit. Part 7 of Act 204 requested the Executive Office on Aging to research the Cash and Counseling program and its implementation in other states, and conduct a cost-benefit analysis of a family caregiver refundable tax credit as proposed in S.B. 1199 SD2 (2007). The committee has invited Dr. Felix Blumhardt of the Center for Training, Evaluation, and Research of the Pacific at the University of Hawaii School of Social Work to present his findings on the Cash and Counseling program; and Dr. Dave Nixon of the Public Policy Center at the University of Hawaii College of Social Sciences to present his analysis of the Refundable Caregiver Tax Credit.

The purpose of the Joint Legislative Committee on Family Caregiving, as stated in Act 285 (2006), is to develop a comprehensive public policy program to support family caregivers who provide unpaid, informal assistance to persons sixty and older with physical or cognitive disabilities. The Committee will consider providing support in categories including but not limited to: coordinated services and policies, training and education, respite services, financial incentives, and balancing work and caregiving.
