<u>HB 3178</u>	RELATING TO CIVIL PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS ON PUBLIC LANDS. Increases civil penalty fine amounts for violations on public lands and clarifies penalties for encroachment on public lands.	JUD, FIN
<u>HB 3174</u>	RELATING TO FEDERAL FISHERIES REGULATIONS. Clarify that the Department of Land and Natural Resources may adopt, amend, or repeal administrative rules to be consistent with federal fishery regulations to improve management and enforcement in a state and federal marine water fishery that has been determined to be in decline.	JUD, FIN
<u>HB 2766, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR56-08)</u>	RELATING TO ELECTRONIC MONITORING. Allows the courts to require electronic monitoring of persons convicted of violating a domestic abuse temporary restraining order or protective order. Appropriates funds for offenders who cannot afford to pay for costs associated with the monitoring device. (HB2766 HD1)	HSH, JUD, FIN


