<u>SB 2373, SD1, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR1100-08)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PSEUDOEPHEDRINE SALES. Requires electronic logs of pseudoephedrine sales to be made via an Excel worksheet provided by the Department of Public Safety Narcotics Enforcement Division and maintained for two years in a form searchable by law enforcement. Effective 1/1/2050. (SB2373 HD1)	HLT, JUD
<u>SB 2745, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2574)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO DEFAMATION. Establishes that communication of defamatory statements by telephone, facsimile, electronic mail, or other computer communication meets the requirement of publication. Eff. 7/1/2050. (SD1)	JUD
<u>SB 2782, SD2, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR1113-08)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO METAL. Includes stainless steel beer kegs in laws intended to prevent theft and resale of copper. Sunsets July 1, 2009. (SB2782 HD1)	CPC, JUD
<u>SB 2898, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2705)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE AGREEMENT AMONG THE STATES TO ELECT THE PRESIDENT BY NATIONAL POPULAR VOTE. Adds a new chapter to Hawaii Revised Statutes to enter Hawaii into an interstate compact to determine the winner of a presidential election by "national popular vote". (SD1)	JUD



<u>SB 2784, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2663)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE POWER OF ARREST. Authorizes agents of the United States Marshal Service to make arrests under state law. Updates references to former U.S. Customs Service and Immigration and Naturalization Service to reflect current names of agencies within the federal Department of Homeland Security. (SB2784 SD1)	JUD
<u>SB 2895, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2879)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO OFFENSES AGAINST PUBLIC ORDER. Adds equine animals as protected under the law pertaining to offenses relating to cruelty to animals. (SD1)	JUD
<u>SB 3203, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2704)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO ANIMAL HOARDING. Makes it a misdemeanor to hoard pet animals. Establishes elements of the offense. (SB3203 SD1)	JUD
<u>SB 3146, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2569)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO CRIMES. Makes it a misdemeanor to consume a cat, dog, or horse. Clarifies definition of "pet animal". (SB3146 SD1)	JUD
<u>SB 1617, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR659)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO LIMITING CIVIL LIABILITY. Limits the civil liability of property owners to persons injured or killed on premises while committing a class A or B felony or certain violent crimes. Effective July 1, 2059. (SD1)	JUD

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

PAPER: 5 copies (including an original) to Room 302 in the State Capitol;

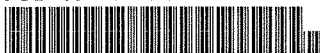
