Status

RELATING TO LAND USE.

Establishes historic agricultural landmarks, designated by law, to be preserved and perpetuated as agricultural land for the benefit of the people of Hawaii. (SB2997 HD1)

Status

RELATING TO PUBLIC LANDS.

Makes violation of chapter 171, relating to public lands and rules adopted thereunder a petty misdemeanor. (SD1)

SB 2094, SD2, HD1
(HSCR1254-08)
Status

RELATING TO DRIVER LICENSES.

Permits the examiner of drivers to waive the test of knowledge of the rules of the road for applicants holding a valid driver's license from another state of the United States, the District of Columbia, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, American Samoa, Guam, a province of the Dominion of Canada, or the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands. (SB2094 HD1)

RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLE DRIVER'S LICENSE.

Adjusts the length of time a person's license will remain valid based on their age and provides that military personnel whose driver's license has expired while on active duty outside of the country will be authorized to drive for 90 days upon their return to the United States. (SB3240 HD1)

Amends best interest of the child criteria and procedures to specify what factors the courts shall consider in making a custody or visitation determination concerning a minor child. Effective 7/1/2050. (SB2054 HD1)	HSH, JUD
<u>SB 2055, SD2, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR1107-08)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO FAMILY COURT. Establishes procedures and requirements for child custody evaluator training and certification. Effective 7/1/2050. (SB2055 HD1)	HSH, JUD, FIN
<u>SB 3092, SD1</u> <u>(HSCR1191-08)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER. Stipulates that only the last four digits of an individual's social security number shall be listed on judgments, orders, or decrees endorsed and recorded in the bureau of conveyances or land court. Effective 1/1/50. (SB3092 SD1)	CPC, JUD
<u>SB 6, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR1230-08)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO OPIHI. Prohibits the selling or offering for sale of 'opihi, except in certain circumstances.	WLH, JUD

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

Persons wishing to offer comments should submit testimony at least 24 hours prior to the hearing with a transmittal cover indicating:

- Testifier's name with position/title and organization;
- The Committee the comments are directed to;
- The date and time of the hearing;
- Measure number; and
- The number of copies the Committee is requesting.

While every effort will be made to copy, organize, and collate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed to the incorrect office, may be distributed to the Committee after the hearing.
