HB 2076

RELATING TO DEPLETED URANIUM
Requires the department of health to establish air sampling stations to monitor for levels of depleted uranium.

HB 2072

RELATING TO VETERANS
Requires office of veterans services to help inform certain members of the Hawaii national guard of federal services for depleted uranium exposure. Prohibits state funds use. Requires office to implement outreach. Requires adjutant general to certify annually that the Hawaii national guard members are informed.

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

- The date and time of the hearing;
- Measure number; and

While every effort will be made to copy, organize, and collate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed to the incorrect office, may be distributed to the Committee after the hearing.

PAPER: 5 copies (including an original) to Room 313 in the State Capitol; or


FAX: For comments less than 5 pages in length, transmit to 586-8504.

EMAIL: For comments less than 5 pages in length, transmit to PSMtestimony@capitol.hawaii.gov.


Testimony submitted will be placed on the Legislative Web site after the hearing adjourns. This public posting of testimony on the Web site should be considered when including personal information in your testimony.
