<u>HB 3273</u>	RELATING TO TRAFFIC INFRACTIONS. Decriminalizes violations of statutes and rules governing traffic and parking in state harbors.	TRN, JUD
<u>HB 2472</u>	RELATING TO COUNTY FEES. Allows counties to impose resource user fee and environmental impact fees on cruise ship owners based on \$ per 500 disembarking passengers. Restricts use of fees to areas directly affected by tourism. Requires prior legislative approval before county may impose fees.	TRN, TAC/EEP, FIN
<u>HB 2439</u>	RELATING TO COUNTY FEES. Allows a county to impose a service fee on a cruise ship owner if the county provides direct services to a cruise ship passenger while the passenger is in the county.	TRN, TAC, FIN
<u>HB 3225</u>	RELATING TO NEIGHBORHOOD ELECTRIC VEHICLES. Amends the definition of neighborhood electric vehicle to include vehicles with gross vehicle weight rating of less than 3,000 pounds.	TRN, JUD
<u>HB 3203</u>	RELATING TO COMMERCIAL DRIVERS. Conforms Hawaii to federal law by closing a loophole that allows individuals convicted of driving under the influence to operate a commercial vehicle on a restructured commercial driver's license.	TRN, JUD
<u>HB 3011</u>	RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLE REGISTRATION. Allows for the greater flexibility in granting special motor vehicle registration.	TRN, JUD



Authorizes the Department of Transportation to establish and collect car rental customer facility charges. Creates a car rental customer facility charge special fund.

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

- The Committee the comments are directed to;
- The date and time of the hearing;
- Measure number; and
- The number of copies the Committee is requesting.

While every effort will be made to copy, organize, and collate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed to the incorrect office, may be distributed to the Committee after the hearing.


