<b>ENE/EDU</b> <a href="#">SB 2231</a> <a href="#">Testimony</a>	RELATING TO ENERGY EFFICIENCY. Appropriates funds to replace all incandescent lighting with compact fluorescent lighting in public schools.	ENE/EDU, WAM
<a href="#">SB 2232</a> <a href="#">Testimony</a>	RELATING TO THE ENVIRONMENT. Appropriates funds to the public school system to establish a recycling program and provide recycling bins on every school campus.	ENE/EDU, WAM
<b>EDU/ENE</b> <a href="#">SB 2774</a> <a href="#">Testimony</a>	RELATING TO EDUCATION. Establishes a task force within the department of education to conduct an analysis into the creation of a comprehensive school recycling program; makes appropriation.	EDU/ENE, WAM
<a href="#">SB 2166</a> <a href="#">Testimony</a>	RELATING TO PUBLIC SCHOOLS. Appropriates funds for grants for public schools that use alternative energy utilities on their campuses.	EDU/ENE, WAM
<b>EDU ONLY</b> <a href="#">SB 2165</a> <a href="#">Testimony</a>	RELATING TO EDUCATION. Appropriates funds for performing arts and fine arts education programs in public middle and high schools.	EDU, WAM

<a href="#">SB 2697</a> <a href="#">Testimony</a>	RELATING TO PHYSICAL EDUCATION. Requires the department of education to implement physical education instruction for grades kindergarten through eight; allows credit to be granted for certain athletic and co-curricular activities; provides for the recruitment of licensed physical education teachers; and makes appropriations.	EDU, WAM
<a href="#">SB 2775</a> <a href="#">Testimony</a>	RELATING TO EDUCATION. Mandates a sex education curriculum that includes the concepts of abstinence, contraception, and sexually-transmitted disease prevention, and is required for graduation from public secondary schools in Hawaii.	EDU, WAM
<a href="#">SB 2167</a> <a href="#">Testimony</a>	RELATING TO STUDENTS. Requires a reduction in class sizes to achieve lower student-to-teacher ratios in public elementary, middle, and high schools. Appropriates funds for staffing needs for the reduction in class sizes.	EDU, WAM
