<a href="#">SB 2981</a> <a href="#">Testimony</a>	RELATING TO LOW-INCOME HOUSING TAX CREDITS. Reduces the period over which state low-income housing tax credits are taken from 10 years to 5 years.	HSP, EDT, WAM
<a href="#">SB 3091</a> <a href="#">Testimony</a>	RELATING TO LIFELONG LEARNING ACCOUNTS. Establishes a Lifelong Learning Accounts program and tax credit in the department of labor and industrial relations to support upgraded training for the incumbent workforce, and encourages participation by employers and employees through tax credit incentives.	HSP, EDT, WAM
<a href="#">SB 3111</a> <a href="#">Testimony</a>	RELATING TO TAXATION. Provides an additional exemption for those with a dependent aged 18 and under with adjusted gross incomes of \$200,000 or less. Modifies and increases the child and dependent care credit.	HSP, EDT, WAM
<a href="#">SB 3117</a> <a href="#">Testimony</a>	RELATING TO INCOME TAX CREDIT. Provides a refundable income tax credit for up to 50% of costs incurred in retrofitting a primary residence for purposes of accommodating aging and disability access.	HSP, EDT, WAM
<a href="#">SB 3183</a> <a href="#">Testimony</a>	RELATING TO DRUG TESTING. Requires recipients of Med-Quest benefits to submit to random drug testing.	HSP, JDL, WAM
<a href="#">SB 3184</a> <a href="#">Testimony</a>	RELATING TO DRUG TESTING. Requires recipients of general assistance, food stamps, and temporary assistance to submit to random drug testing.	HSP, JDL, WAM
