<u>SB 2546</u> <u>Testimony</u>	RELATING TO OFFENDER REENTRY. Makes clarifying amendments to chapter 353H, Hawaii Revised Statutes, relating to the offender reentry program.	PBS, WAM
<u>SB 2344</u> <u>Testimony</u>	RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY. Requires the department of public safety to establish performance indicators to ensure that the department is in compliance with the Community Safety Act of 2007. Requires monthly reports to the legislature, using key performance indicators, such as inmate drug test failure rates, educational goals achieved, reentry plans, post-incarceration employment, victim restitution paid, and recidivism rates.	PBS
<u>SB 2082</u> <u>Testimony</u>	RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY. Appropriates funds to the department of public safety to develop a plan by July 1, 2008, to return all female Hawaii prisoners incarcerated in mainland prisons back to Hawaii by July 1, 2009.	PBS, WAM
<u>SB 2341</u> <u>Testimony</u>	RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY. Requires prisons holding Hawaii prisoners under a contract with the State to make public information about the operation of the prison	PBS, JDL
<u>SB 2342</u> <u>Testimony</u>	RELATING TO THE AUDITOR. Requires the auditor to conduct performance audits of private prisons on the mainland that house Hawaii prisoners. Makes appropriation.	PBS, WAM
<u>SB 2343</u> <u>Testimony</u>	RELATING TO PAROLE. Establishes an earned-time program that provides incentives for inmate rehabilitation by allowing inmates to become eligible for parole when they make consistent progress in completing programs while incarcerated. Appropriates funds.	PBS, WAM
<u>SB 2130</u> <u>Testimony</u>	RELATING TO CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES. Requires the narcotics enforcement division of the department of public safety to maintain an electronic purchase logbook for sales of pseudoephedrine and related substances.	PBS, JDL



<u>SB 2334</u> <u>Testimony</u>	RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY. Repeals exemption from civil service of the first and second deputy sheriff; requires the deputy director for law enforcement and the sheriff to be graduates of a law enforcement academy.	PBS, JDL
<u>SB 2081</u> <u>Testimony</u>	RELATING TO THE HAWAII PENAL CODE. Enacts procedures for pardons; requires the governor to give public notice of intended pardons.	PBS, JDL
