It is with pleasure that the Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) recommends Senate confirmation of the appointment of John B. Naeole to the Maui/Lanai Island Burial Council.

The Island Burial Councils were established under Chapter 6E-43.5, Hawai'i Revised Statues, to determine the preservation in place or relocation of previously identified native Hawaiian burial sites and to determine Hawaiian cultural and lineal descendancy claims for specific burials.

State law requires that Island Burial Councils be established for Hawai'i, Maui/Lanai, Molokai, Oahu and Kaua'i/Ni'ihau islands, and be comprised of representatives from specific geographic regions and representatives of developer/large property owners. John Naeole was nominated to serve as the Makawao District representative on the Maui/Lanai Island Burial Council. If confirmed, John Naeole will serve until June 30, 2012.

John Naeole is a maintenance supervisor for the Maui Pineapple Company where he has worked for 35 years. He is a member of the Royal Order of Kamehameha I, Kahekili Chapter IV and currently serves as an Officer on a statewide level. His background and strong desire to serve make him a welcomed candidate to serve on the Maui/Lanai Island Burial Council.

The Department greatly appreciates your consideration of John B. Naeole and strongly recommends his confirmation to the Maui/Lanai Island Burial Council.
