Senator Espero, Senator Nishihara, and Members of the Committee:

I fully support the confirmation of Mr. Theodore G. M. Jung to the Correctional Industries Advisory Committee. As you are aware, there is established within the Department of Public Safety (Department) a committee known as the Correctional Industries Advisory Committee. This Committee advises the Department on the feasibility of entering into venture agreements with private sector businesses to utilize the services of qualified, able-bodied inmates.

The Correctional Industries Advisory Committee consists of nine members who are appointed by the Governor. Hawaii Revised Statutes 345D-5 states that the Governor shall designate at least two members representing private sector business. Mr. Jung represents the second private sector member. In response to your letter on 3/27/08 regarding my nomination to the Correctional Industries Advisory Committee (CIAC); I have enclosed my resume and referral letters.


