Senator Espero, Senator Nishihara, and Members of the Committee:

The Department of Public Safety (Department) fully supports the nomination and confirmation of Mr. David Matsuura to the Correctional Industries Advisory Committee for a term that would expire on June 30, 2012. There is established within the Department a committee known as the Correctional Industries Advisory Committee.
