The Office of Housing and Community Development (OHCD) opposes House Bill 2238 HD1, SD1, which would require public housing and affordable housing projects developed with state and/or county funds to remain affordable in perpetuity.

The County of Hawai'i is currently in the predevelopment stages of its 1,200-unit Kamako at Waikoloa Workforce Housing Project, which aims to provide affordable housing in perpetuity. And though the County would promote this practice in all of its projects, enacted legislation requiring perpetuity would remove the County's flexibility to provide mixed use development an attractive mechanism used to encourage further development of affordable housing in the face of escalating land and/or development costs.
