PROPOSED H.B. NO. 2466 H.D. 1

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO WILDFIRE MANAGEMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 46, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
- 2 by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to
- 3 read as follows:
- 4 "§46- Wildfire management; fireworks prohibited zone.
- 5 To promote wildfire management, each county, by enactment of an
- 6 ordinance, may grant the county's fire chief the authority to
- 7 declare, on an ad hoc basis, a geographic area or areas within
- 8 the county's jurisdiction a fireworks prohibited zone in which
- 9 no fireworks or articles pyrotechnic, as those terms are defined
- in section 132D-1, may be used for a designated period of time.
- 11 The county's fire chief shall declare an area a fireworks
- 12 prohibited zone at least hours prior to the start of any
- 13 authorized use of fireworks or articles pyrotechnic under
- 14 chapter 132D, after first determining that conditions in the
- 15 area are such that the use of fireworks or articles pyrotechnic
- 16 constitutes a fire hazard and poses a substantial risk to the
- 17 public."



- 1 SECTION 2. Section 132D-17, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "\$132D-17 Inconsistent county ordinances, rules.
- 4 [Notwithstanding] Except for section 46- , notwithstanding any
- 5 other law to the contrary, no county shall enact ordinances or
- 6 adopt any rules regulating fireworks or articles pyrotechnic,
- 7 except as required in this chapter, that is inconsistent with or
- 8 more restrictive than, the provisions of this chapter. Any
- 9 ordinances and rules regulating fireworks or articles
- 10 pyrotechnic that were enacted or adopted by a county before
- 11 March 31, 1995, except those provisions [which] that are not
- 12 inconsistent with, or more restrictive than, those of this
- 13 chapter[7] are declared void."
- 14 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 15 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 16 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Wildfire Management; Fireworks Prohibited Zones

Description:

Allows counties to enact ordinances to authorize county fire chiefs to declare, at least hours before authorized start of fireworks use, a geographic area or areas a fireworks prohibited zone for a period of time, if such use constitutes a fire hazard and poses substantial risk to the public. (HB2466 HD1)
