- **Department's Position:** The Department of Health supports this measure but respectfully suggests 1
- 2 different language to set the salary for this position.
- **Fiscal Implications:** The bill as currently written would increase the salary of the Director of the 3
- 4 Executive Office on Aging (EOA) by \$10,815. This increase could be accommodated within the
- 5 Department of Health budget.
- Purpose and Justification: This measure proposes to amend section 349-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, 6
- to increase the salary cap set for the Director of the Executive Office on Aging from sixty-nine percent 7
- to eighty percent of the salary of the Director of the Department of Human Resources Development 8
- (DHRD). The Department respectfully suggests that the language setting the EOA Director's salary as a 9
- 10 percentage of the DHRD Director's salary be eliminated and replaced with the following: "Effective
- July 1, 2008, the director shall be paid a salary set by the appointing authority." 11
- Salaries set in statute as a percentage of the Director of DHRD's salary are especially low 12
- because the Director of DHRD's pay is in the lowest category of pay for department heads and is lower 13
- that the maximum rates applicable to civil service division chiefs. The Department believes it is in the 14

- State's best interest to permit the appointing authority to determine the appropriate compensation for this
- 2 position in order to attract and retain highly qualified individuals.
