Purpose:

Directs department of education to implement recommendations of the online learning task force.

Department's Position:

The Department strongly supports this bill and requests the Legislature's support in accepting the online task force's recommendation to initially fund \$1.5 million annually over the three years of expansion. Providing \$4.5 million implementation funding over three years creates the necessary momentum to develop a sustainable growth model.

Online learning is the strategic vehicle that makes possible the transformation of the Department of Education into a 21<sup>st</sup> Century learning institution. It provides a flexible, alternative environment for our students. It is the catalyst for the delivery of education and training throughout the P-20 landscape, as well as workforce development for Hawaii. Adequate funding necessary for thoughtful, systematic implementation of learning structures involving many stakeholders will be crucial to realizing the possible future of Hawaii.
