Purpose:

Directs department of education to implement recommendations of the

online learning task force.

Department's Position:

While the Department strongly supports this bill and requests the Legislature's support in accepting the online task force's recommendation, we do not support H.B. 2971 (HSCR 145-08) at this time due to Hawaii's impending fiscal austerity and priority for the current Board of Education's budget requests. Should funds be available beyond the Board's priorities, we request initial funding of \$1.5 million annually over the three years of expansion. Providing \$4.5 million implementation funding over three years creates the necessary momentum to develop a sustainable growth model.

Online learning is the strategic vehicle that makes possible the transformation of the Department of Education into a 21<sup>st</sup> Century learning institution. It provides a flexible, alternative environment for our students. It is the catalyst for the delivery of education and training throughout the P-20 landscape, as well as workforce development for Hawaii. Adequate funding necessary for thoughtful, systematic implementation of learning structures involving many stakeholders will be crucial to realizing the possible future of Hawaii. 

## TESTIMONY BEFORE THE HOUSE COMMITTEE ON FINANCE

Chair Oshiro and Members of the Committee:

The Hawaii State Teachers Association agrees with the intent of HB 2971.

The Association believes as we move into the twenty-first century, technology is playing an increasingly larger role in learning and education. The Online Learning Task Force, established by Act 275 in the 2007 Legislative Session, has provided the Department of Education (DOE) a plan to expand the online learning opportunities for our students. This bill directs the DOE to adopt and implement the recommendations and strategic goals contained in the plan. These recommendations and strategic goals support the goals set forth in HSTA's Every Child Succeeds document.

However, we have found that there is an ongoing debate on the effectiveness of online learning and its effect on public schools as it may affect school populations and the availability of classroom teacher positions.
