Subject: House Bill 3022
Relating to State Constitution

The Department of Planning and Permitting **supports** House Bill 3022. It amends the state constitution to explicitly allow the counties to participate in tax increment financing (TIF) programs.

Under Act 267 (1985), the state adopted a new provision that allows the counties to establish tax increment districts, create tax increment funds, and issue tax increment bonds (Part VI, Chapter 46, HRS). However, there remains a concern that the state constitution does not recognize TIF programs. Thus, this bill would effectively resolve the matter.

While we are not a financing agency, we support TIF as one incentive for good transitoriented development (TOD) projects. We note that many mainland cities offer TIF as part of a range of public incentives to the private sector, with TIF becoming a common element in publicprivate partnerships. Many other cities own land adjacent to transit stations that can be leveraged to yield desirable TOD projects. However, because the City and County of Honolulu owns little land adjacent to planned stations we need to have other incentives available. While we have no plans to embark on a TIF program soon, it is useful to have this flexibility.

Please adopt House Bill 3022. Thank you for the opportunity to testify.
