Testimony of Chiyome Leinaala Fukino, M.D. Director of Health February 13, 2008

- Department's Position: The Department of Health supports the intent but prefers H.B. 3123,
- 2 introduced by the Administration.
- 3 Fiscal Implications: None.
- 4 **Purpose and Justification:** The proposed legislation would amend 323D, HRS, to require acute care
- 5 facilities to provide long-term care beds in any certificate of need application. While the Department
- 6 recognizes that Hawaii suffers from a severe shortage of long-term care beds, the Department does not
- believe it prudent to require acute care providers to build and operate long-term care beds as a means of
- 8 addressing this shortage. Many acute care providers in Hawaii are struggling financially and adding
- 9 long-term care requirements may serve to further erode their financial positions. In addition, acute care
- providers may be reluctant to seek approval for new technologies and services because of the burden of
- providing long-term care beds on the same certificate of need application. As a result, new health care
- technologies may not be available to the citizens of Hawaii.
- The proposed legislation would eliminate the State Health Coordinating Council and the Review Panel.
- The Department prefers H.B. 3123 that streamlines the entire certificate of need process in a more
- thorough and comprehensive manner.

Testimony in opposition to HB 3326.

I am Rich Meiers, President and CEO of the Healthcare Association of Hawaii, which represents the entire spectrum of health care, including acute care hospitals, two-thirds of the long term care beds in Hawaii, as well as home care and hospice providers. Thank you for this opportunity to testify in opposition to HB 3326, which changes the structure of the organization that implements the certificate of need (CON) process.

CON requires certain health care providers to obtain state approval before offering certain new or expanded services. It is designed to help ensure that new services proposed by health care providers are needed for quality patient care within a particular region or community. CON prevents unnecessary duplication of services by selecting the best proposal among competing applicants who wish to provide a particular health service.

The Healthcare Association recognizes that CON is not perfect, but any changes should be initiated from within SHPDA or the Statewide Health Coordinating Council.

For the foregoing reasons, the Healthcare Association opposes HB 3326.
