- 1 Department's Position: The Department of Health supports this measure requesting the counties to
- 2 adopt and implement standards for the reuse of residential gray water for subsurface landscape
- 3 irrigation.
- 4 Fiscal Implications: None.
- 5 Purpose and Justification: The department has rules that allow for the construction and use of gray
- 6 water systems for subsurface irrigation for residences with individual wastewater systems. The
- department supports the reuse of gray water for irrigation; however, the department does not have the
- 8 resources to oversee dwelling units that are located in county sewered areas.
- This resolution will encourage the counties to adopt and implement the gray water standards for
- 10 residential subsurface irrigation as provided under the current Uniform Plumbing Code (UPC)
- Standards. This will let residences served by county sewers the option to utilize their gray water for
- onsite subsurface irrigation.
