## SB 1487, SD2, HD1 Relating to Controlled Substances

ATE TESTIMONY

Chair Waters, Vice Chair Oshiro and Committee members. Mahalo for this opportunity to provide testimony on SB 1487, SD2, HD1 which will update Hawaii's controlled substances laws to be consistent with that of federal law.

The Hawaii Pharmacists Association supports this bill, as it reflects the collaborative work done in 2007 that was facilitated by the Association in partnership with the Board of Pharmacy, the Department of Health Food & Drug Branch, the Narcotics Enforcement Division, as well as various pharmacies and health care organizations.
