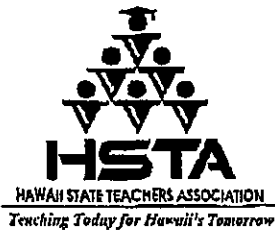

Title: S.B. 2080, SD 1 (SSCR2145), Relating to teacher licensure

Purpose: To require the Hawaii Teacher Standards Board to revoke a teacher's license when the teacher has been convicted of certain sexual offenses against minors.

Department's Position: The Department of Education supports S.B. 2080, SD1 (SSCR2145) which requires the Hawaii Teacher Standards Board (HTSB) to revoke a teacher's license when the teacher has been convicted of certain sexual offenses against a minor. The Department supports the technical amendments made to S.B. 2080, SD 1 (SSCR2145).

The safety of our students is paramount. It should be noted that HTSB is currently incorporating the revocation of teacher licenses based on convictions of sexual/other offenses into their administrative rules, making statutory changes unnecessary if the new rules are adopted before this proposal can be enacted.
