Testimony Supporting the Intent (With Concerns) for

S.B. 2513 - Relating to Assisting Persons Under a Compact of Free Association

I. OVERVIEW OF CURRENT PROPOSED LEGISLATION

Senate Bill 2513 appropriates funds to the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations ("Department") for the creation of a full-time State Coordinator position. The State Coordinator position is intended to assess and promote the enhancement of self-sufficiency services provided to Compact of Free Association ("COFA") migrants.

Additionally, the State Coordinator will promote partnerships between government agencies, community-based organizations, and the citizens-at large of the State in an effort to improve the living conditions of COFA migrants.

II. CURRENT LAW

Currently, the Department's Office of Community Services ("OCS") provides for the coordination of services to the COFA community.

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III. SENATE BILL

The Department supports the intent of S.B. 2513, however, we cannot support the current language or appropriation. Further, we believe this legislation is premature because the COFA Task Force is still working on its findings.
