- · A reasonable mentor to new/beginning teacher ratio
- Individual induction plans for each participating teacher
- Program evaluation and improvement
- · Regular and frequent meetings between the mentor and new/beginning teacher
- Release time to allow teachers to observe exemplary teachers
- Use of the New Teacher Center Formative Assessment system which aligns with the Hawaii Teacher Performance Standards

On page 4, line 4-5, we suggest that consideration be given to selecting mentors who show evidence of working effectively with adult learners.
