Thank you for the opportunity to submit testimony in strong support of SB 2741. SB 2741 authorizes the issuance of general obligation bonds for the planning, design, development, and equipment for additional long-term care beds for the Maui region of the Hawaii health systems corporation.

The Maui Health Initiative Task Force reported to the Legislature the need for more longterm care beds in the County of Maui. The general obligation bonds authorized in this bill will help to plan, design, develop, and equip additional long-term care beds in the Maui Region. This bill would allow for the possibility of public/private partnerships to develop additional long-term care beds. These additional beds are critical to addressing the current long-term care wait list problem Maui Memorial Medical Center (MMMC) faces where patients are forced to occupy acute care beds in the facility due to the lack of available long term care beds in the community. This situation causes a tremendous financial hardship on MMMC and removes the availability of much needed acute care services from the community.
