- Department's Position: The Department supports this measure but recommends that it be amended.
- 2 Fiscal Implications: Unquantified.
- 3 Purpose and Justification: The Department of Health supports this bill, which requires deposit
- 4 beverage retailers and dealers with more than 75,000 square feet of interior retail space to operate
- 5 deposit beverage container (DBC) redemption centers.
- The department believes that deposit beverage container redemption services should be a requirement
- for all deposit beverage retailers and dealers and not just those with more than 75,000 square feet of
- 8 interior retail space; however, retailers and dealers with less than 5.000 square feet of interior space
- 9 should continue to be exempted from providing DBC redemption services. The department also
- 10 continues to support comprehensive recycling programs such as curbside recycling.
