## Senate Bill 3166 Relating to The Hawaii Community Development Authority

Chair Yamashita and Committee Members:

I support the passage of Senate Bill 3166 because it will clearly state the intention of the 2006 Legislature to include community members on the Hawaii Community Development Authority(HCDA) board.

I am Dexter Okada. I am the president of U. Okada & Co., Ltd., a third generation small family business that has been located on Queen Street in Kaka'ako for over fifty years. I also represent the Kaka'ako Business and Landowners Association, a group of small businesses and small landowners. As a result of Act 252, I am also a member of the HCDA board.

In the 2006 session, I supported SB2487(Act 252) because I believed that there should be more community representation on the HCDA board. In 2007 because of my involvement with small business community issues in Kaka'ako, House Speaker Say put my name in for nomination to the HCDA, the Administration nominated me, and the Senate confirmed me. Since Act252 did not clearly state the Legislature's intent and a question of conflict of interest was brought up, a letter from Senate President Hanabusa and House Speaker Say was sent to the Hawaii State Ethics Commission to clearly state the Legislature's intent to put two community members on the HCDA board. But then, the Attorney General's office advised that the letter of intent was not enough and that the two community members not participate until the Section 206E-3 was amended or new law passed.

I hope that SB3166 resolves this problem and if the Governor selects me to be one of the two small business representatives, I can fulfill my purpose for accepting the nomination to be on HCDA board, to represent the small businesses community.

Dear Chairman Yamashita, Vice Chairman Wakai and Committee Members:

I am a small business owner and landowner in the Kakaako District and I am in strong support of S.B. 3166.

There are many small businesses in the Kakaako district that are being adversely affected by the rapid development of the area. Rising property taxes, increased density, looming assessments on infrastructure improvements and the impact of mass transit, etc., are just some of the issues that are or will be negatively impacting these businesses.

Recent studies completed by HACBED (Hawaii Alliance for Community Based Economic Development) showed that businesses in the Mauka area, which is comprised of mostly small businesses, contribute 3.9% of the State's economy and employs over 16,000 workers.
