LATE TESTIMONY

We offer recommendations to SECTION 1 regarding limiting any awards to an entity based on years. We suggest that the criteria not be "years" or time, but rather

- community need,
- project viability and
- assessment of outcome impact to the community.

Change verbiage to: SECTION 1: "42F- Grants and subsidies; limits, No entity shall be awarded a grant or subsidy under this chapter more than once every—years. Entities may receive a grant or subsidy under this chapter based upon a determination of community need, project viability and potential outcome impact to the community."
