SUBJECT: S.C.R. 133 & S. R. 69 – REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES TO CONVENE A TASK FORCE AND ESTABLISH A PILOT PROJECT TO ADDRESS THE NEEDS OF NATIVE HAWAIIAN CHILDREN IN CHILD CUSTODY PROCEEDINGS

PURPOSE: The purpose of this resolution is to request the Department convene a task force to examine the possibility of implementing a Native Hawaiian Child Welfare Act and to jointly develop procedures and protocols and conduct a one-year pilot project to collaborate in case managing Native Hawaiian children in child welfare cases under the jurisdiction of the Department.

DEPARTMENT'S POSITION: The Department of Human Services (DHS) supports the intent of this resolution. We support the need for a task force to examine the feasibility and practicality of enactment of a Native Hawaiian Child Welfare Act. We are willing to participate on the task force, but with their concurrence, recommend that Na Kupuna O Waianae convene

the task force and bring the parties together. We are also willing to examine the feasibility of conducting a pilot project, but recommend that be a topic discussed in the task force as part of their work.

We would also suggest that the timeframe for completion of the task force is insufficient for such a significant and potentially far-reaching issue. We would recommend a two-year task force with a progress report due prior to the convening of the 2009 Legislative session.

H. C. R. 174, H. D. 1 “Requesting Na Kupuna O Waianae To Convene A Task Force To Address The Needs Of Native Hawaiian Children In Child Custody Proceedings” contains language and provisions that effectively address the Department’s concerns and suggestions.
