**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1 SECTION 1. Section 200-37, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is  
2 amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows:

3 "(c) No person shall operate a thrill craft in the waters  
4 of the State, except:

5 (1) In areas and during time periods designated by the  
6 department; [~~and~~]

7 (2) Through areas designated by the department to serve as  
8 avenues for the ingress and egress of thrill craft  
9 between the areas designated under paragraph (1) and  
10 the shore[~~-~~];

11 (3) Authorized government personnel conducting operations  
12 approved by the department; or

13 (4) Authorized film production permit holders conducting  
14 operations approved by the department."

Thrill Craft

**Description:**

Authorizes government personnel conducting operations approved by the Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) and film permit holders involved in film production conducting operations approved by the Department to operate thrill crafts in non-designated areas.

JUSTIFICATION SHEET

DEPARTMENT: Land and Natural Resources

TITLE: A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THRILL CRAFT OPERATION.

PURPOSE: To authorize government personnel conducting operations approved by the Department and film permit holders involved in film production conducting operation approved by the Department to operate thrill crafts in non-designated areas.

MEANS: Amend section 200-37(c), Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS).

JUSTIFICATION: Currently, section 200-37(c), HRS, only allows individuals to operate thrill crafts in designated areas of state waters. The statute is silent with regard to operating thrill crafts in non-designated areas by state personnel.

Thrill crafts have proven to be an effective tool for monitoring the natural resources and providing public safety. They are used by county lifeguards and due to their minimal draft and jet drive systems, thrill crafts are able to access areas that boats are unable to operate in.

This bill proposes to allow authorized government personnel conducting operations approved by the Department to operate thrill craft in non-designated areas for official government business.

The Hawaii Film Office (Film Office) has requested an exemption be placed within section 200-37(c), HRS, to allow authorized film production conducting operations approved by the Department, to similarly operate thrill craft in non-designated areas. As the Department recognizes Hawaii's unique scenic qualities play a

major part in attracting filming in the islands, the Department concurs with the Film Office's request, and has proposed amending section 200-37(c), HRS, accordingly.
