### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDERS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 586-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended as follows: 3 1. By amending subsection (a) to read: 4 Upon petition to a family court judge, an ex parte 5 temporary restraining order may be granted without notice to 6 restrain either or both parties from contacting, threatening, or 7 physically abusing each other, and grant exclusive care of a pet 8 animal, as defined by section 711-1100, to a party, 9 notwithstanding that a complaint for annulment, divorce, or 10 separation has not been filed. The order may be granted to any 11 person who, at the time the order is granted, is a family or 12 household member as defined in section 586-1 or who filed a 13 petition on behalf of a family or household member. The order 14 shall enjoin the respondent or person to be restrained from 15 performing any combination of the following acts: 16 (1)Contacting, threatening, or physically abusing the 17 protected party;

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1	(2)	Contacting, threatening, or physically abusing any	
2		person residing at the protected party's residence;	
3		[ <del>or</del> ]	
4	(3)	Entering or visiting the protected party's	
5		residence[-]; or	
6	(4)	Visiting, taking, concealing, threatening, physically	
7		abusing, or otherwise disposing of a pet animal that	
8		is in the exclusive care of the protected party."	
9	2.	By amending subsection (c) to read:	
10	"(c)	The family court judge may issue the ex parte	
11	temporary restraining order orally, if the person being		
12	restrained is present in court. The order shall state that		
13	there is probable cause to believe that a past act or acts of		
14	abuse have occurred, or that threats of abuse make it probable		
15	that acts of abuse may be imminent. The order further shall		
16	state that the temporary restraining order is necessary for the		
17	purposes of: preventing acts of abuse or preventing a		
18	recurrence of actual domestic abuse[+] and granting exclusive		
19	care of a pet animal; and ensuring a period of separation of th		
20	parties involved. The order shall also describe in reasonable		
21	detail the act or acts sought to be restrained. Where		
22	necessary	, the order may require either or both of the parties	
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1	involved to leave the premises during the period of the order,		
2	and also may restrain the party or parties to whom it is		
3	directed from contacting, threatening, or physically abusing the		
4	applicant's family or household members. The order shall not		
5	only be binding upon the parties to the action, but also upon		
6	their officers, agents, servants, employees, attorneys, or any		
7	other persons in active concert or participation with them. The		
8	order shall enjoin the respondent or person to be restrained		
9	from performing any combination of the following acts:		
10	(1)	Contacting, threatening, or physically abusing the	
11		protected party;	
12	(2)	Contacting, threatening, or physically abusing any	
13		person residing at the protected party's residence; or	
14	(3)	Entering or visiting the protected party's	
15		residence[-]; or	
16	(4)	Visiting, taking, concealing, threatening, physically	
17		abusing, or otherwise disposing of a pet animal that	
18		is in the exclusive care of the protected party."	
19	SECT	TION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that	
20	matured,	penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were	
21	begun, before its effective date.
