BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

	DRINKING WATER AND WASTEWATER INFRASTRUCTURE
	SECTION 1. The purpose of this part is to enable Hawaii to
r	eceive and use moneys under the federal American Recovery and
R	einvestment Act of 2009 and any later federal laws for drinking
W	ater or wastewater infrastructure.
	SECTION 2. Chapter 340E, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
aı	mended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
a	nd to read as follows:
	"§340E- Use of American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of
2	009 and other federal moneys. (a) The director may provide
f	inancial assistance to public water systems for the
C	onstruction of necessary drinking water infrastructure
p	rojects, through the drinking water fund, using moneys from the

- 18 priority to projects that incorporate renewable energy, energy

17	TOTAL MAXIMUM LOAD COORDINATOR
18	SECTION 6. Chapter 342D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
19	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
20	and to read as follows:
21	"§342D- Total maximum daily load coordinator. The

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1 each entitled "total maximum daily load coordinator". The total 2 maximum daily load coordinator positions shall, among other 3 duties, assist the department to meet federal requirements for 4 establishing total maximum daily loads in Hawaii. This includes 5 quantifying waste load allocations and load allocation limits on 6 pollutant loading of Hawaii inland and marine waters and 7 developing technically based plans for achieving the State's 8 stated water quality goals. The positions shall be appointed by 9 the director without regard to chapter 76. These positions **10** shall be funded by federal grants to the State under the Federal 11 Water Pollution Control Act of 1972, P.L. 92-500 (33 U.S.C. **12** \$1251-1387), as amended." 13 PART III APPROPRIATIONS AND GENERAL PROVISIONS 14 15 SECTION 7. There is appropriated out of federal funds 16 received by the State from the American Recovery and 17 Reinvestment Act of 2009 and any other applicable federal acts 18 the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be necessary 19 for fiscal year 2009-2010 to fund drinking water and wastewater **20** infrastructure projects pursuant to part I of this Act. 21 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 22 health for the purposes of part I of this Act.
