
HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE MANAGEMENT OF HAWAIIAN AIRLINES AND THE AIR LINE
PILOTS ASSOCIATION TO SWIFTLY NEGOTIATE A FAIR AND
REASONABLE NEW LABOR CONTRACT.

1 WHEREAS, contract renegotiations between the pilots of
2 Hawaiian Airlines represented by the Air Line Pilots
3 Association, International and the management of Hawaiian
4 Airlines for an expired June 1, 2007, contract has been on-going
5 for more than two years; and
6

7 WHEREAS, the more than four hundred Hawaiian Airlines
8 pilots have been working under concessionary contract terms,
9 both in and out of bankruptcy, for almost ten years and have
10 consistently sacrificed pay, retirement, work rules, and quality
11 of life to assist Hawaiian Airlines and its passengers whenever
12 they were called upon to do so; and

14 WHEREAS, Hawaiian Airlines has been consistently profitable
15 since 2004, even while in bankruptcy and when other airlines
16 have gone out of business; and

18 WHEREAS, the management of Hawaiian Airlines has refused to
19 negotiate reasonable contract terms with the pilots association
20 to enable pilots to receive compensation comparable to their
21 peers in the airline industry, even while Hawaiian Airlines has
22 plans to spend \$4,000,000,000 for new aircraft; and

24 WHEREAS, the failure to reach a quick and amicable
25 agreement can affect the tourism and transportation industries
26 two of the most vital components of the State's economy, and any
27 potential strike or labor dispute involving Hawaiian Airlines
28 could severely damage both industries and deepen the State's
29 recession; now, therefore,

1 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
2 Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session
3 of 2009, the Senate concurring, that the management of Hawaiian
4 Airlines and the Air Line Pilots Association, International are
5 urged to do everything in their power to swiftly negotiate a
6 fair and reasonable new contract that includes meaningful pay
7 raises and other compensation for pilots, while recognizing
8 Hawaiian Airline's need to remain competitive and financially
9 viable; and

11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the management of Hawaiian
12 Airlines and the Air Line Pilots Association, International are
13 urged to recognize that peaceful resolution of disputes between
14 labor and management should be the preferred goal of all
15 unionized employers and employees in Hawaii; and

17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the management of Hawaiian
18 Airlines and Air Line Pilots Association, International are
19 urged to strive to achieve this goal; and

21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
22 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the President and Chief
23 Executive Officer of Hawaiian Airlines and the President of the
24 Air Line Pilots Association, International.
