HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE OFFICE OF HAWAIIAN AFFAIRS TO WORK WITH THE HAWAI'INUIĀKEA SCHOOL OF HAWAIIAN KNOWLEDGE OF THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII TO DEVELOP A KUPUNA HONORARY DEGREE PROGRAM.

WHEREAS, the Nobel prize was first awarded in 1901 and is widely regarded as the most prestigious award an individual may receive in various fields; and

WHEREAS, the Nobel prize is a prize that is awarded based on purely western standards; and

WHEREAS, Hawaiian kupuna worldwide are also deserving of recognition for their contributions, but based entirely on Hawaiian standards; and

WHEREAS, Hawaiian kupuna have made many significant contributions to all Hawaiians and to the world; and

WHEREAS, the concept of the kupuna honorary degree program originated with Kumu Hula Keli'i Tau'a; and

WHEREAS, it is proper for a process to be established to appropriately recognize and honor eligible kupuna in a manner and on a level similar to the Nobel prize, but based on Hawaiian standards; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2009, the Senate concurring, that the Office of Hawaiian Affairs is requested to work with the Hawai'inuiākea School of Hawaiian Knowledge of the University of Hawaii to develop a kupuna honorary degree program, which shall award the pohaku degree, intended to be the Hawaii equivalent to the Nobel prizes, to eligible Hawaiian kupuna; and

1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Office of Hawaiian Affairs, 2 working with the Hawai'inuiākea School of Hawaiian Knowledge, is 3 requested to consider including in any kupuna honorary degree 4 program it develops the following categories of the honorary 5 pohaku degree, according to varying minimum age requirements: 8 (1)Religion; 9 10 (2) Health; 11 (3) Agriculture; 12 13 (4)Fishing; 14 15 16 (5) Crafts and weaving; 17 (6) Celestial navigation; 18 19 20 (7) Education; 21 (8) 22 Government; 23 (9) Business; 24 25 26 (10)Performing arts, including hula and chant; 27 (11)Fine arts; and 28 29 30 (12)Music; and 31 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Office of Hawaiian Affairs 32 is requested to work with the Hawai'inuiākea School of Hawaiian 33 Knowledge to establish the kupuna komike, which shall establish 34 35 standards for award of the degree, and to consider including at 36 least the following criteria: 37 Contributions to the community; and 38 (1)39 40 (2) Qualifying age for varying categories of degrees; and 41 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the kupuna komike, when 42 established, is requested to award the pohaku degree to eligible 43 44 Hawaiian kupuna; and HCR LRB 09-1626-3.doc

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Office of Hawaiian Affairs, working with the Hawai'inuiākea School of Hawaiian Knowledge in developing the program, is requested not to restrict the award of the pohaku degree to persons within the State of Hawaii but to award the degree to individuals worldwide; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Office of Hawaiian Affairs, working with the Hawai'inuiākea School of Hawaiian Knowledge, is further requested to consider providing a financial prize of some kind to each pohaku degree recipient; and

 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to Kumu Hula Keli'i Tau'a, the Director of the Hawai'inuiākea School of Hawaiian Knowledge of the University of Hawaii, and the Chairperson of the Board of Trustees and the Administrator of the Office of Hawaiian Affairs who, in turn, is requested to distribute copies to all appropriate Hawaiian entities within and outside the State.
